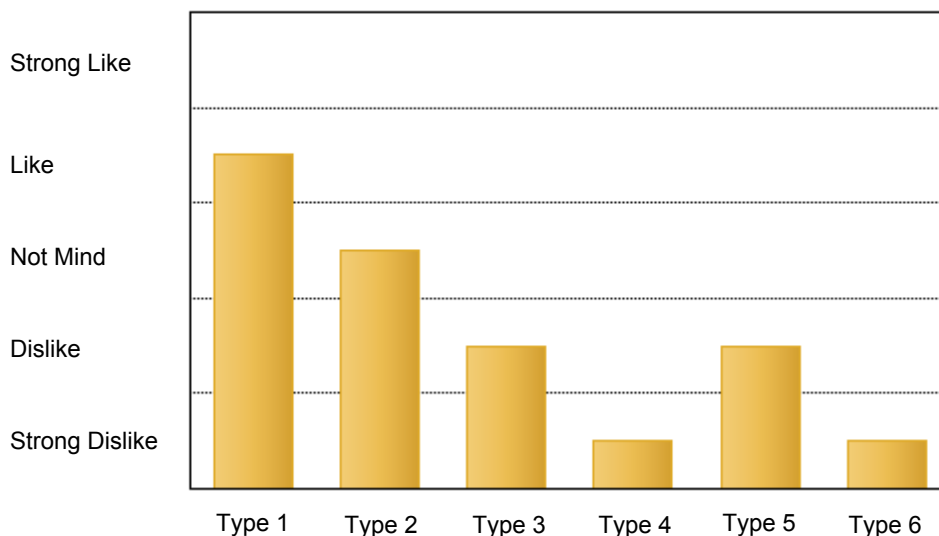

### **You like Interest Type 1 - Technical work, science and engineering**

It appears that you enjoy work which involves designing, developing, inventing and building new products for science and engineering. These products could include machines, roads, ships, technical equipment and scientific instruments. Setting up and using laboratory apparatus to carry out tests could also appeal to you, so too could drawing up plans for electrical or electronic circuits and inspecting these for faults. You may be interested in solving technical problems, doing mathematics or using computers too.

### **You don't mind Interest Type 2 - Animals, plants and nature**

Overall you seem not to mind the type of work where you can use a knowledge of biology and chemistry. However you may be able to pick out some parts which appeal to you more than others. This knowledge could be used to plan and organise farming, forestry or horticultural projects or to carry out laboratory work. You could be involved in the study of plant or animal breeding, rearing animals or looking after crops or advising other people about these things. You might also be involved in analysing laboratory specimens or testing them using laboratory apparatus. You probably do not mind work where you would be helping others to treat people or animals.

### **You dislike Interest Type 5 - Caring for people**

It might not be a good idea to consider the sort of work where you would be responsible for the welfare of individuals or families. Counselling people, advising them or giving them guidance may not interest you. This work requires understanding and insight as well as sympathy and skill in giving people advice and help. You might not enjoy hospital work, the care of children, the rehabilitation of criminals, work with people with special needs or care of the mentally ill.

**You dislike Interest Type 3 - Shops, offices and accounts**

Perhaps you are not interested in organising, managing and supervising office and sales work. Bargaining and negotiating agreements and settling disputes may not appeal, neither may planning the advertising and of selling goods. Working with figures, carrying out financial calculations and giving advice on money matters are other areas in which you might not want to be involved.

**You have a strong dislike for Interest Type 6 - Writing and talking**

Work which requires skill in writing or speaking and a good knowledge of grammar does not appeal to you. This includes writing essays, articles and reports. You will not enjoy acting, performing in public, taking part in debates, broadcasting or giving talks. You do not like using languages or interviewing people. In addition library work and other work which requires an interest in books, literature, theatre or poetry does not attract you.
